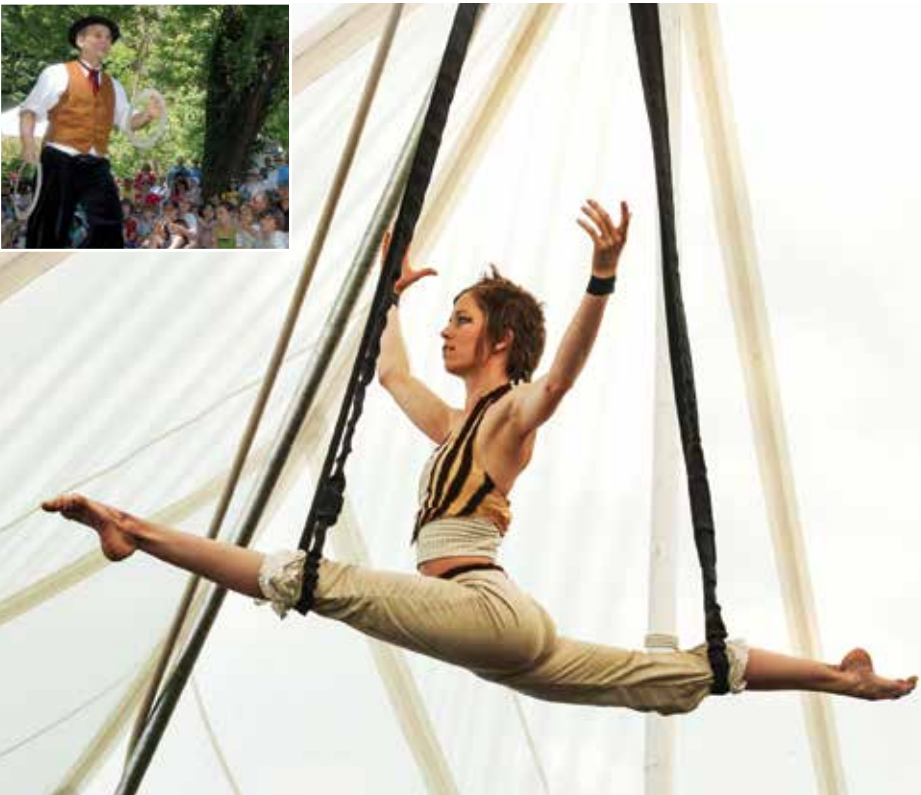
Discover Pinkster! at Philipsburg Manor

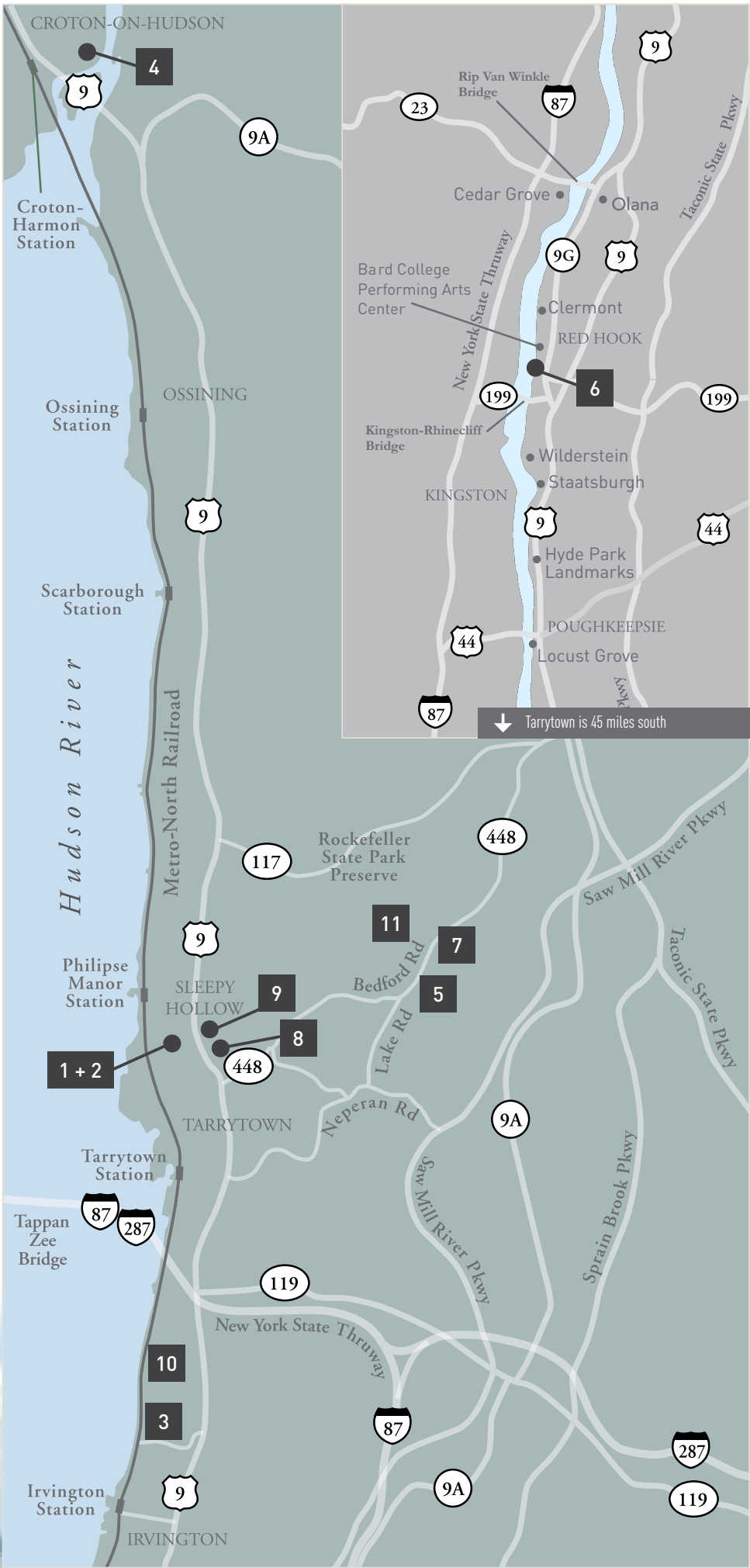

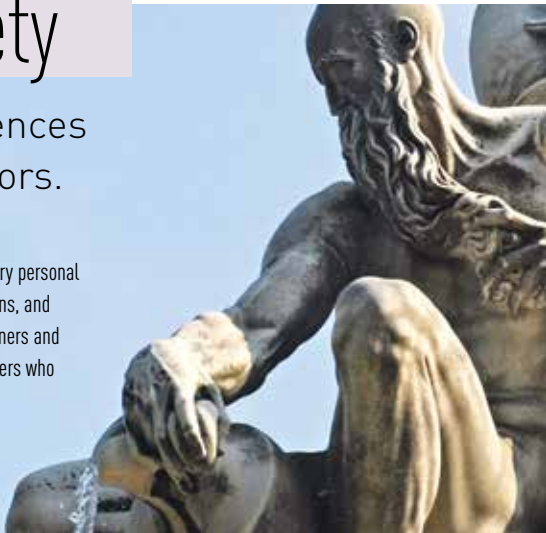

This serene site boasts a nationally significant landscape influenced by the great Andrew Jackson Downing and an architectural landmark house updated by Alexander Jackson Davis. The estate, home to a branch of the Livingston family for two centuries, includes elaborate gardens and a walking trail to a waterfall. Seasonal mansion tours showcase Davis’s masterful work. You can also enjoy fresh produce from the popular Montgomery Place Orchards Farm Stand.

Expanded public programs at Montgomery Place are underwritten in part by John S. Dyson and Richard H. Jenrette, whose multi-year gifts are intended to stimulate sustaining support from the community.
